Let discipline continue to guide you not as a set of rules, but as a way of life.

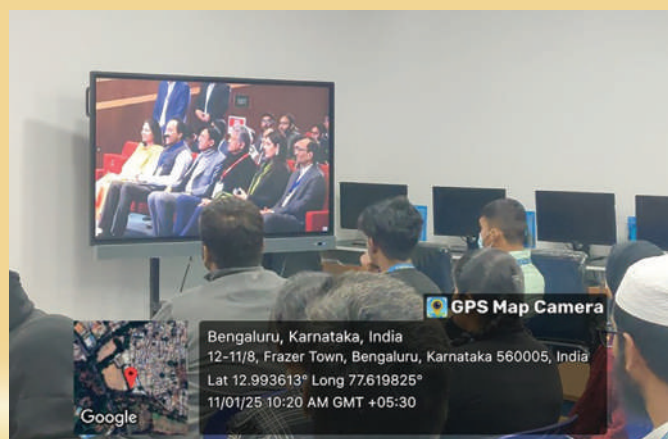

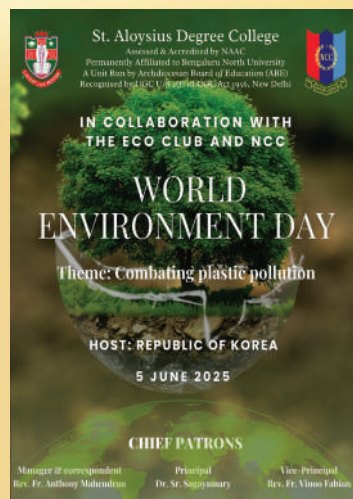
ENVIRONMENT DAY 2025
